## 1.1 Foreword

Through its initiatives in these areas, the Ministry plays a vital role in strengthening the Federation and promoting national unity.

The Inter Provincial Coordination Division, originally established on December 24, 1971, published its first Year Book for 2007–08. The present Year Book highlights the Division's activities, objectives, and achievements during the Financial Year 2022–23. It has been prepared to provide valuable information to the Cabinet, government officials, researchers, scholars, and the general public. It is hoped that this publication will serve as a useful and informative reference document.

## 1.2 Introduction

The Ministry of Inter Provincial Coordination (IPC) was originally established on December 24, 1971, under the direct leadership of the Prime Minister. After periods of intermittent activity, the Prime Minister approved the establishment of a fully functional Inter Provincial Coordination Division within the Cabinet Secretariat on March 19, 2007. At that time, all IPC-related functions previously handled by the Cabinet Division were transferred to the new Division. Later, on November 3, 2008, it was upgraded to a full-fledged Ministry. Following the 18th Constitutional Amendment, the Ministry's responsibilities expanded significantly, and corresponding amendments were made to the Rules of Business, 1973, to reflect these changes.

## 1.3 Vision

Pakistan, as a democratic federation, enjoys the full trust and confidence of all its federating units. In accordance with the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973, every province should actively contribute to national development without any apprehension of dominance or exploitation by larger provinces. All federating units participate in the formulation of national policies and in addressing challenges faced in social, political, economic, and administrative spheres. Through their discussions and deliberations, inter-governmental forums play a vital role in fostering effective provincial harmony and strengthening unity between the Federation and the Provinces.

## 1.4 Mission

- To serve as an effective platform for building trust and confidence between the Federation and the Provinces, as well as among the provinces themselves
- To establish a forum for dialogue and discussion aimed at facilitating and resolving policy matters of shared national concern.



### 3.2 Research Officer (Development) Section

During financial year 2023-24, following major assignments were undertaken in respect of sports infrastructure projects, funded through PSDP 2023-2024:

1. Allocation of budget.
2. Quarterly releases to the projects.
3. Convened meetings with executing agency i.e. Pakistan Sports Board to resolve issues hurdling in execution of the projects.
4. Convened meetings with Planning Commission.
5. Convened meeting of Departmental Development Working Party (DDWP), wherein, the forum approved the project titled “Air-Conditioning of Liaqat Gymnasium at Pakistan Sports Complex” at a cost of Rs.470.382 million without FEC with an implementation period of 24 months.

2. Initially, an allocation of Rs.1, 900 million was earmarked in PSDP 2023-24 for seventeen (17) projects. Later on, Ministry of Planning, Development & Special Initiatives authorized Rs.1, 520 million for these projects. Out of the final grant of Rs.1, 161.270 million; an amount of Rs.1, 151.135 million was spent for provision of sports facilities i.e. laying of Synthetic Hockey Turfs, Rehabilitation/Up-gradation of Sports Facilities and other sports infrastructure across the country ([Annex-I](#)).

  - During the FY 2023-2024 Ministry of IPC received 11 Senate Starred Questions and 01 Senate Un-Starred Question. After approval from the competent authority these Question was forwarded to the Senate Secretariat within stipulated time. On the Rota Day of Ministry of IPC during Sessions of the Senate of Pakistan

these Questions were properly responded by the Minister on the floor of the House.

- Establishment, administration and management of the affairs of the Gun and Country Club in Islamabad [Gun and Country Club Bill, 2023] and referred to the National Assembly Standing Committee on IPC 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2023 and in its meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2023 considered the bill and the same reported the Standing Committee. The Committee unanimously recommended that bill as reported by the Committee may be passed and bill was passed by the National Assembly on 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2023 and by the Senate on 4<sup>th</sup> August, 2023. It received assent of the President on 7<sup>th</sup> August, and published in the Gazette of Pakistan.

## Major Assignments Performed

#### 4.5 Federal Land Commission (FLC) Department

The Federal Land Commission is statutory body of the Federal Government of Pakistan created on 3<sup>rd</sup> January, 1973 through an Act of the parliament by inserting Para 4-A in the Land Reforms Regulation, 1972 (MLR-115) and then reconstituted under land reforms Act, 1977. FLC is a quasi-judicial forum provided with the revisionary jurisdiction to hear and decide the matters pertaining to Land Reforms of any nature. This judicial forum consists of Registry and Legal Sections to assist and manage the Court work. Provincial Inspection Teams located at four provinces also assist the Courts.


