INTRODUCTION

Ministry of Inter Provincial Coordination was created initially on 24-12-1971, when it was headed by the Prime Minister himself. With intermittent interruptions, the Prime Minister of Pakistan approved the creation of a full Inter Provincial Coordination Division in the Cabinet Secretariat w.e.f. 19th March, 2007. The IPC related functions of the Cabinet Division were transferred to the Inter Provincial Coordination Division at the time of its creation. Subsequently, it was made a full fledge Ministry w.e.f. 3rd November, 2008. Due to 18th Amendment, the responsibilities of the Ministry of IPC have increased. Necessary amendments have been made in the Rules of Business, 1973 accordingly.

VISION

Pakistan, a democratic Federation, enjoys full confidence of its all Federating units. In line with the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973, each Province should play its role in nation building without fear of domination/exploiting by the larger Provinces. 

3.1.1 Federal Land Commission

The Federal Land Commission is statutory body of the Federal Government of Pakistan created on 3rd January, 1973 through an Act of the parliament by inserting Para 4-A in the Land Reforms Regulation, 1972 (MLR-115) and then reconstituted under land reforms Act, 1977. FLC is a quasi-judicial forum provided with the revisionary jurisdiction to hear and decide the matters pertaining to Land Reforms of any nature. This judicial forum consists of Registry and Legal Sections to assist and manage the Court work. Provincial Inspection Teams located at four provinces also assist the Courts.

Major assignments performed by the IPC Wing

The major achievements performed by the IPC Wing during financial year 2022-2023 are as under:

- Shortage of Water Supply in Galiyat Township was raised by Government of KPK in IPCC meeting. The matter was referred to Law Division. The legal opinion has been received and shared with KPK and Punjab. The matter shall be further discussed in the next IPCC meeting.
- In pursuance of Cabinet Decision the Ministry of Inter-Provincial Coordination was directed to coordinate with all Provincial Governments for implementation of the Cabinet Decision regarding National Energy Conversations Measures. Accordingly the IPC coordinated with all Provincial Governments and conveyed the outcome to the Prime Minister's Office for information.
- In pursuance of Cabinet Decision the Ministry of IPC was directed to coordinate with all Provincial Governments for implementation of the Cabinet Decision regarding National Austerity measures. Accordingly, the IPC coordinated with all Provincial Governments and conveyed the outcome to the Prime Minister's Office for information.
- Coordinated with Provinces and relevant Federal Ministries to dispose-of a number of cases pertaining to the Senate Secretariat and National Assembly Business. Also processed various Joint Resolutions adopted by the Provincial Governments for seeking views / comments from Federal Ministries.
- Worked on three summaries (i. Illegal Trawling and continuous violation by Sindh Based Trawlers. ii. Allocation of funds for Federal Levies Forces Balochistan. iii. Outstanding liabilities of 05 Devolved Cadet College) of the Government of Balochistan and guide them for their dispose of as per rules.

- Processed various Constitution Amendment Bills forwarded by Ministry of Law & Justice for seeking comments/reports from Provinces.
- Processed a Summary for the PM to transfer the subject of PVMC from the Ministry of Inter-Provincial Coordination (IPC) to the Ministry of National Food Security & Research.
- Notified a Committee, constituted on the direction of PM's Office regarding to Build Consensus for Regulating Conversion of Agricultural Land to Housing Societies in Pakistan, Conducted two meetings of the Committee and submitted comprehensive report to the PM's Office and Ministry of Planning Development and Special Initiatives.
- Initiated a Summary for the PM to transfer the subject of IPCC to CCI Secretariat.
- Besides, coordinated a number of miscellaneous matters with various Ministries/Divisions as well as Provincial Governments during the period are in proves.
- processed the Draft Ordinance regarding Hemp Regulatory Authority of Pakistan amongst provinces, conduct meeting, circulated policy guide lines and minutes of the meeting to all Provinces as well as relevant stakeholders.

Goal was set to train forty eight (48) faculty member of accredited veterinary institutions throughout the country during the financial year 2022-2023.
